Build-A-Word Game



Purpose:

- Deepen understanding of morphological word families
- Practice building multi-syllabic words
- Use competition and collaboration as motivation

Materials:

- Markers
- Blank Paper or Whiteboard

Instructions:

Start with "Roll-a-Base" - this is a more advanced activity

- 1. Using two markers, decide which color will represent the base and which will represent the affixes (prefixes and suffixes).
- Students brainstorm outloud different words they want to add to the board.
 For example: David might call out "recalling". The student or the scribe will write this on the board or the paper using the different markers to show the base and affixes.
- 3. Once the board is filled or the time has expired (you can set a timer if this helps your student) you can count up the points!
- 4. Challenge your student to beat their high score every time!

Extension for those who are familiar with Structured Word Inquiry:

Write out the words as word sum.
 call + ing → callings



Points:

- 5 points each prefix
- 5 points each suffix
- 10 points each base

Example:

recalling (re+call+ing=20 points)

players (This counts as two suffixes! er+s = 20 points)
